CONSTITUTION

Preamble

The name of this body shall be Concord Baptist Association. It is composed of cooperating Southern Baptist Churches whose confession of faith affirms the Word of God as its guide for faith and practice, and supports the principles, beliefs, and programs of the Concord Baptist Association, the Tennessee Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article I – Purpose

The purpose of this association shall be:

1. To foster fellowship among the churches cooperating with this association.
2. To assist the churches in strengthening their ministries of enlistment, evangelism, teaching, and training.
3. To encourage the churches in the promotion of missions and the establishment of new churches.
4. To promote those ministries of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention as it may deem proper.
5. To promote the Mission Statement, Vision Statement and Core Values of the association.

Article II – Membership

A church may be a member of Concord Baptist Association upon fulfilling the following criteria:

1. A church shall affirm the Word of God as its guide for faith and practice, and support the principles, beliefs, and ministries of the Concord Baptist Association, the Tennessee Baptist Convention, and the Southern Baptist Convention.
2. A church shall petition the association through the Administrative Leadership Team.
3. The association reserves the right to withdraw membership from a member church or withhold membership from a petitioning church which does not affirm the Word of God as its guide for faith and practice, and does not support the principles, beliefs, and ministries of the Concord Baptist Association, the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article III – Seating Messengers

1. Each church shall be entitled to five messengers. Each church shall be entitled to one additional messenger for each 50 members over 100 until a maximum of 10 is reached. Said representatives shall be messengers to the association upon credentialing at the Annual Meeting.
2. A two-thirds (2/3) majority shall be necessary to refuse to seat messengers from a member church.
3. A two-thirds (2/3) majority shall be necessary to seat messengers from a new church.

Article IV – Visitors

Visitors may be invited to be seated in the body with all privileges except that of voting or speaking to a motion in regular business session.

Article V – Officers

1. The regular officers to be elected by the association shall be moderator, vice moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and assistant treasurer.
 - a. The moderator and vice moderator shall be nominated from the floor.
 - b. All others officers shall be nominated by the Administrative Leadership Team.
 - c. No one shall serve as moderator for more than two (2) consecutive years.
2. The duties of the moderator shall be to preside over all meetings of the association, put all proper motions to the body, appoint committees not otherwise provided for and see that a suitable decorum is preserved in the meetings. The moderator shall also serve as chairman of the executive committee. The moderator shall be an ex-officio member of all committees/teams.
3. The duties of the vice moderator shall be to perform the functions of the moderator in his absence and to assist in any other ways that the moderator or association may desire. The vice moderator shall be an ex-officio member of all committees/teams.
4. The duties of the clerk shall be to keep correct records of the proceedings of the annual associational meetings and the executive committee meetings together with a list of the messengers composing them and publishing them in due form and time.
5. The treasurer shall make authorized disbursements of all associational funds. The treasurer shall make a monthly report to the executive committee and an annual report to the association showing all receipts and disbursements.

Article VI – Authority

The association recognizes the autonomy of the local churches and shall exercise no authority over them. It shall nevertheless, be the duty of the association to offer fraternal counsel to any church upon request of said church. (Matthew 18: 15-17)

Article VII – Annual Meeting

1. The association shall hold an annual meeting at such time as the association may indicate.
2. A quorum shall be the messengers representing at least 50 percent of the cooperating Baptist churches.

Article VIII – Executive Committee

1. The association shall have an executive committee composed of the moderator, vice moderator and clerk of the association as its officers. One member and the pastor from each member church shall be members on the executive committee. For every 100 members or fraction thereof a church may appoint 1 (one) additional member up to a total of ten (10) executive committee members.
2. The executive committee shall transact the business of the association between annual sessions or any other business committed to it by the association in annual session.
3. A quorum will consist of those members present at the meeting.
4. It shall include meetings – the third Monday of February, May, and August.
5. The moderator in consultation with the Director of Missions, the vice moderator and the associational clerk shall be authorized to call the executive committee into special sessions.
6. A minimum of two weeks' notice is required for a called Executive Committee Meeting.

Article IX – Revision

Any article of this constitution may be revised by said article being presented in printed form one year before the association is to vote. Any revision must be approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority.

Article X – Procedures

1. The moderator elected at the previous meeting of the association shall give the executive committee report at the opening session, reviewing the work of the past year.
2. This Constitution and By-Laws and Robert's Rules of Order shall be the standard of authority in parliamentary rulings.

BY-LAWS

1. Each meeting of the association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise and address the moderator; and while speaking, he shall confine himself strictly to the subject in question and shall not be interrupted unless he digresses from the subject, and in no wise reflects on any other speaker, to give fairly his own views of the cause without undue criticism. No member shall address another in any unchristian manner.
3. The moderator shall be entitled to the same privileges as any other member provided he vacates "the chair" but shall have no vote except in the case of a tie.
4. The names of the messengers shall be published in the Minutes as they have registered at the associational meeting.
5. The associational year shall be September 1 through August 31.
6. The associational fiscal year shall be January 1 – December 31.
7. By-Laws shall be revised by majority vote of the Executive Committee.
8. Associational Committees and their Duties.

Membership on all standing committees shall be on a rotation basis unless otherwise indicated, with one-third (1/3) elected annually for a three year term. No person shall succeed himself until one year has elapsed. Membership on all elected committees shall be distributed as far as possible among lay people and staff members of local churches. The following committees shall serve the association and shall report to the bodies indicated. The composition and duties of these committees shall be as follows:

A. Personnel Committee

This committee shall be composed of three members. The committee shall screen all of those nominated to them by the appropriate committee for employment by the association. The committee shall call or recommend the employment or dismissal of employed personnel to the Executive Committee or the association in Annual Session.

B. Finance Committee

This committee shall be composed of six (6) members: The treasurer and financial secretary shall be ex-officio members. This committee shall:

1. Recommend procedures and plans for all money matters connected with work in the Concord Association and report to the Executive Committee on matters related to the financial status of the association.
2. The committee shall prepare the budget for the association's consideration and approval. The proposed budget will be mailed to the Executive Committee members prior to the Annual Meeting at which time the budget will be voted on by the Executive Committee and forwarded to the association for final approval.
3. Promote a program of stewardship education and clinics on church finance.
4. Encourage churches to contribute and to increase contributions to the cooperative Program and associational missions through their church budgets.

9. Associational Teams and their Duties.

Team members will be recruited or accepted to work on specific tasks and move toward performance groups. Teams may have defined membership who may serve indefinite terms based on task completion. The team leaders will be chosen by the Administrative Leadership Team. Members will be approved by the Administrative Leadership Team for a specific team. The number of members per team may vary as determined by the Administrative Leadership Team. Team leaders will be elected at an Executive Board or the Annual Meeting. Team Leaders will serve only one team at a time.

Team members, by definition are persons who have expertise, gifts, skills and preferences to complete a certain task or mission.

A. Mission and Ministry Team Shall:

- (1) Develop and implement the mission and ministry plans of the association.
- (2) Train, develop and encourage church and associational workers.
- (3) Provide opportunities for working together in missions and ministry.
- (4) Report to Executive Committee as necessary.

B. Church Support Team Shall:

- (1) Develop and implement support to ministries within the churches.
- (2) Coordinate training events for ministries inside the churches.
- (3) Encourage fellowship groups
- (4) Offer consultation and support to church staff with responsibilities in area of church programs.

- C. Evangelism Team Shall:
- (1) Develop and implement evangelism strategies for the association.
 - (2) Coordinate training events to encourage evangelism efforts in local churches.
 - (3) Offer consultation and support to local church staff in the area of evangelism.
- D. Administrative Leadership Team Shall;
- (1) Serve as a coordinating team for the total mission of the association.
 - (2) Be empowered to act for and on behalf of the Executive Board between meetings of the board.
 - (3) Create, adjust and dissolve teams as needed to accomplish the mission of the association.
 - (4) Review proposals and make recommendations to the Executive Board concerning the constitution.

TRUSTEES

1. The association shall elect three trustees, each to serve three years, with their terms to rotate that the term of one will expire each year. The chair shall be selected by the Administrative Leadership Team.
2. Any vacancy occurring between Annual Meetings shall be filled by the Executive Committee upon recommendation of the Administrative Leadership Team.
3. The trustees shall be the legal representatives of the association and shall act for the association upon orders of the Executive Committee. Their responsibility involves all legal matters, protecting the interests of the association where any process of law is required.

Concord Baptist Association Annual Meeting

October 17, 2016

Session One – 5:30 PM

Northside Baptist Church

The 2016 annual meeting of Concord Baptist Association was hosted by Northside Baptist Church, Murfreesboro.

Meeting called to order by Moderator, Curt Wagoner at 5:30pm.

Welcome and opening prayer by Dr. Kevin Minchey, Director of Missions.

Rev. Curt Wagoner seated the messengers. All in favor.

Recognition of Reports:

Executive Committee Report was given by Rev. Curt Wagoner.

Rev. Kenneth Summey spoke to the Financial Report.

We have seen an increase in giving in our churches this year, and we are right on track for the year.

Rev. Kenneth Summey thanked all the churches for their giving.

No questions asked.

Dr. Kevin Minchey spoke to the DOM report.

Dr. Minchey thanked everyone for their giving, and he is very encouraged on how things are going.

Dr. Minchey spoke about church revitalization, and how Evangelism and Disciple- making is very important in order to reach our community.

Vision of Concord: Connecticut and Rhode Island. Disaster Relief Ministry. Intentional disaster relief efforts.

Rev. Curt Wagoner spoke to the Admin. Leadership Report. The names in bold print will be voted on for the new year.

Rev. Leonard Rader spoke to the Mission Ministry Report. Rev. Rader mentioned the locations our churches have gone to. We were able to help with 26 mission trips this past year.

Rev. Rader spoke to a mission trip report that was submitted to Concord from Lasscassas Baptist Church. Lasscassas went on a medical mission trip. They also provided a bicycle repair ministry. Balance is over \$800,000.00 in our Mission Ministry Fund.

Kenneth Summey spoke to the proposed budget for the 2017 year. Rev. Summey said that we were able to stay very close to the 2016 budget. He spoke to the increase in some line items and a decrease in others.

Director of Missions Report

In Mark chapter 2, we find Jesus preaching in a house in Capernaum. Four men carried one paralyzed man with the hope that they could get their friend to Jesus. As you know, this story ended with Jesus being struck by the faith of the four men who worked together to deliver the one man into His presence. The principle of cooperation that drives the local association is found in the above passage from Mark chapter 2. It took each man taking a corner of the bed to bring this one person to Jesus. If we are going to make progress in making disciples of the thousands who do not know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior within the reach of our Association of churches, it will take teamwork. For over 200 years, we have seen the effectiveness of cooperation within our Association. As we closed out 2015, the Kendrick Brother's movie War Room was released nation-wide December 15, 2015. I was privileged to lead a couple of Prayer Boot Camps. Claude King developed Prayer Boot Camp as a response to those who came away from viewing the movie War Room with a desire to know how to enter into a deeper level of prayer.

2016 began on a high note with our First Annual Concord Baptist Association Evangelism Conference Jan 17-19 at First Baptist Church Walter, Hill. The line-up of preachers included Don Whitt, Ken Whitten and Ed Litton. Cold weather and ice were a challenge but we had a good attendance and everyone left edified. The Second Annual Concord Baptist Association Conference is scheduled to be hosted by Giles Creek Smyrna Jan 29-31, 2017.

For the second year in a row, I led a team of pastors & wives to Guatemala for church leadership training. April 30-May 6. This year we led sessions in Coban and Guatemala City.

Summer always means Vacation Bible School and this year we made the rounds to as many churches as my schedule would allow. Many children heard the gospel and decisions were made as a result of VBS this year. Since our last Annual meeting we were saddened by the sudden loss of two of our beloved pastors: Raouf Ghattas November 25, 2015 and Dan Watts July 27, 2016. Raouf and Dan were partners in ministry up until Dan's recent retirement as Raouf began the Arabic Baptist Church and Dan offered Grace Baptist Church as the initial host location for the new church.

We were pleased to partner with the Tennessee Baptist Convention as Parkway Baptist, Smyrna hosted the *Making Connections* Sunday School Training Sept 1, 2016.

The First Annual Concord Baptist Association Golf Scramble was held at Cedar Ridge Golf Course in Walter Hill September 29, 2016.

Starting October 30, 2016, there will be a new church plant meeting at the Concord office building. We are partnering with Brentwood Deaf congregation to launch the Murfreesboro Deaf Church.

If I may use my DOM report to briefly cast vision. I believe we need to take the necessary steps to restart an active Disaster Relief response team in our Association. If any of our churches have a Disaster Relief team in place, please let me know. As we move into 2017-2018 I would like to encourage our churches to explore the New England partnership the Tennessee Baptist Convention has just agreed to. We will be taking vision trips to New England beginning in May 2017, specifically Connecticut and Rhode Island. It is a privilege and a joy to serve you as your Director of Missions. Please let me know how I can best serve you and your church in the upcoming year.

2015-16 School Year - Weekly ministries

- Gathering – Thursdays, 7:00 pm. Worship and Bible study. Average of 55 per week.
- Noonday – Wednesdays, 11:30 am. Luncheon with food provided by local churches. Proceeds go to our BCM Student Missions Fund. Average of 50 per week in the Fall and 45 in the Spring.
- Leadership Team Meetings – Leadership Team met on a weekly basis on Sunday nights at 8 p.m. Each team leader met with their team at various times throughout the week. We had 19 students serve on our leadership team last year.
- Serve Team - Met every other Monday night for the Fall and Spring semester. The purpose for this team is for leadership training in an effort to develop future leaders for the ministry. We had an average of 15 at each meeting.
- Small Groups – We had 10 Life transformation groups meeting on a weekly basis on various days and at various times. Each group had 3-4 students each.

Ministry Highlights.

- Our BCM offered one short-term mission trip and several local missions opportunities this year for students. For Spring Break, we took a team of 18 MTSU students to Panama City for Beach Reach, an evangelistic outreach sponsored by Lifeway. We partnered with Dyersburg State Community College, who took 6 students, for this trip.
- We continued the focus of Noonday Lunch as a strong outreach approach. Relationships and conversations at the tables are essential to building new relationships with students.
- Throughout the school year, BCM students raised over \$3,500 for Missions. This will go to support the TBC Collegiate Missions Program sending Tennessee students across the globe for missions.
- The BCM partnered with two other campus ministries in the annual Thanksgiving Dinner for International Students. Over 150 students came for a traditional American meal and program.
- During the summer, 13 of our students served in ministry positions through various entities, i.e. ministry camps as counselors, short-term missions, and ministry internships. Six of those students were sent through Send TN, our state BCM missions program. Our BCM also participated in the 9 Orientations at MTSU for new students, welcoming students and sharing about the opportunities available through BCM.
- For next year, we will have a leadership made up of 29 students. They will be divided into two groups, Family Group Leaders (our new small group approach) and Ministry Leaders.

Thank you so much for partnering with us as we invest in the lives of college students and for giving to our ministry through the Concord Baptist Association and the Cooperative Program. We could not do what we do without the support and partnership of our local churches. Please continue to pray for us as we seek to reach the 22,000 students of Middle Tennessee State University.
